For a stylish take on Italian cuisine enjoy a lunch or dinner a L'Uva Enoteca in the Tobacco Campus. An innovative menu and reasonable prices make this a great spot for a date night, dinner with friends, or business lunch. I would

be remiss to mention Italian food in Durham without acknowledging Toast, on Main Street. Perfect for lunch or an early dinner, Kelly is constantly coming up with new and delicious sandwich combinations. The line is worth the wait.

Both Baba Ghannouj and Saladelia will get you good Mediterranean food quickly and for a good price. For a nicer meal out, try Papas Grille. Again, in a strip mall but some of the best food in town.

Last but not least, a visit to Halgo in South Durham is a real treat. With Polish owners very committed to bringing high-quality and interesting food to Durham you are sure to leave with an interesting treat.

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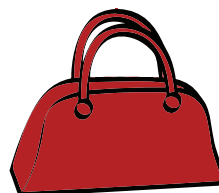
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WELCOME TO THE DURHAM RED.
